- 2. A minimum of 120 credits is required for all bachelor's degrees.
- 3. A minimum Lehman College cumulative average of 2.0 in the overall average, major, AND minor (if needed).
- 4. Completion of **at least** 30 credits in residence (i.e., credits earned at Lehman College). These 30 or more credits

must include at least  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the credits in the major and at least  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the credits in the minor.

## Notes:

See the Testing Office in Shuster 205 for an appointment to take the CUNY/ACT Compass Mathematics Skills Assessment Test. Once you have taken the test, see the Mathematics and Computer Science Department in Gillet 211 (718-960-8120) for placement and permission to register. Everyone needs one math course numbered 125 or higher; the recommended math course for Multimedia Journalism is MAT 132: Introduction to Statistics. (MAT 132 can serve as a substitute for BBA 303 in the Management minor.)

See the Languages and Literatures Department in Carman 257 for information on placement testing in Spanish.

You need one substitute course each for COR 102 (Social Sciences distribution courses) and COR 106 (Natural Sciences distribution courses).

You need one distribution course each in Social Science, Natural Science, Literature, and Comparative Culture.

See a faculty advisor in the Economics and Business Department in Carman 377 (718-960-8297) for advice on your major requirements.

To declare your major and minor, pick up the Declaration of Major and Minor form in Shuster 106, have it signed by your faculty advisors, and return the form to Shuster 106. This must be done before your sixty-first credit.

You need at least 120 credits to graduate.
