4. Rationale:

As HEA 400 is presently taught HEA 267 and two additional 300-level HEA courses provide sufficient specific and general background. Thus HEA 249 is no longer needed as a prerequisite. Similarly, there currently is sufficient coverage of school, community health agencies, etc., programs within HEA 400 to make the co-requisites unnecessary. The reduction in pre- and co-requisites will allow more students, especially those majoring in the proposed B.S. Public Health major, to take this course.
