B. Admission Requirements for Senior College Program

Associate Degree Graduates of CUNY Colleges are exempt from all lower-division Lehman College General Education requirements. To earn a Bachelor's Degree at Lehman College, CUNY Associate Degree graduates need to:

- complete the courses required for the major/minor
- two upper-division interdisciplinary courses
- one writing intensive course (satisfied with PSY 305)
- and elective courses if needed.

Determination of the 90 Liberal Arts credits required for the baccalaureate degree in accordance with New York State Education Department requirements will be made by Lehman College.

The undergraduate program in psychology at Lehman College is intended to serve three principal objectives:

- 1. to contribute to the liberal education of all students by providing an understanding of psychology as a science and as a profession;
- 2. to provide an understanding of psychological principles and techniques for those students interested in work in other behavioral and social sciences and in professional fields such as education, social work, and medicine; and
- 3. to establish a sound foundation for those planning to pursue graduate studies in psychology that can lead to careers in college teaching, scientific research, clinical psychology, and school psychology or to professional work in industry, government, and social agencies.

Associate in Arts Degree from Bronx Community College.

Bronx Community College graduates with the <u>Associate Degree</u> in <u>Liberal Arts / Psychology Option</u> will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of <u>Arts</u> in <u>Psychology</u> at <u>Herbert H. Lehman</u> College. In addition, they will be deemed to have met all general education requirements at <u>Herbert H. Lehman</u> College.

E. Articulation Agreement Follow-Up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:

Bronx Community College Associate in Arts Degree, Psychology Option coordinator will review implementation of the agreement once a year to ensure that students are adequately informed of the program and to identify issues requiring attention.

After transfer into the Lehman Studio Psychology major, the performance of Bronx Community College students will be tracked using the CUNY Institutional Research Data Base.

Notice of articulation will be placed in the respective catalogues, recruiting brochures, websites, and on the CUNY TIPPS website.

Respective transfer and academic advisers will be informed and provided with copies of this agreement.

The Lehman Department of Psychology will coordinate efforts with Lehman's Admissions Office to make certain that materials are sent with recruitment officers for BCC's biannual Transfer Day event.
