- elective courses, if needed
- 90 liberal arts credits are required for the BA, 60 liberal arts credits for the BS and 30 Liberal Arts Credits for the BBA.

Determination of the 30 Liberal Arts credits required for the baccalaureate degree in accordance with New York State Education Department requirements will be made by Lehman College.

Westchester Community College graduates with the <u>Associate of Applied Science Degree</u> in Business Administration will receive 60* credits toward the Bachelor of <u>Business Administration (BBA)</u> at <u>Lehman</u> College.
