Senate Undergraduate Committee on Curriculum

A quorum was present. All votes taken were unanimous.

1. The minutes of the meeting of Oct. 6, 2010 were approved.
2. The committee elected Barbara Jacobson as chair of the UCC and Alice Akan as the committee's representative on the Ad Hoc Committee on Structure.
3. A Proposal from the Department of Environmental, Geologic and Geographic Sciences to change the prerequisite of GEP 228 was approved.
4. A proposal from the Department of Journalism, Communication and Theatre to change the degree requirements, credit hours and program description of the 55 credit Major in Dance, B.A. was approved.
5. Proposals from Department of Journalism, Communication and Theatre create a new experimental course, THE 449 was approved.
6. Proposals from the Dept. of Political Science to create a new course, POL 234, was approved.
7. The committee approved proposals from the Interdisciplinary Program in Linguistics to create two new courses, LNG 341 and PSY(LNG) 342, both subject to minor editing.
8. A Proposal from the Dept. of English to change the B.A. Degree Requirements was approved, subject to revisions.
9. The committee approved proposals from the Dept. of English to create new courses ENG 341, ENG 349 and ENW 364.
10. Proposals from the Dept. of English to create new courses ENG (WST) 344 and ENG (WST) 345 were approved, pending the approval of the Women's Studies Program.

11. Proposals from the Dept. of English to create new courses ENG 340, ENG 342, ENG 343, ENG 482, ENW 482, ENW 217, ENW 300, ENW 303, ENW 304, ENW 305, ENW 306, ENW 324, ENW 325, ENW 333, ENW 334, and ENW 335 were approved, pending minor editing.
12. The committee approved proposals from the Dept. of English to change the course titles, descriptions and prerequisites of ENG 301, ENG 302, ENG 319, ENG 321, ENG 322 ENG 347, ENG 348 and ENG 463, the course number of ENW/THE 408 and the prerequisite of ENW 365.
13. Proposals from the Dept. of English to change the course title, description, prerequisite and note of ENG 338 and ENW 381, the course title of ENG 381, the course title and description of ENG 260, the course title, description and prerequisite of ENG 460 and ENW 323 and the cross-listing and prerequisites of ENW 309 were approved, pending minor editing.
14. Proposals from the Dept. of English to change the course title, description, prerequisite and credits of ENG 300 and ENG 481, the course number of ENW 357, the prerequisite and note of ENW 381, the course description and prerequisite of ENW 461 and ENW 462 and the course description, prerequisite, credits and note of ENW 481 were approved, subject to minor editing.
15. Proposals from the Dept. of English to withdraw courses ENG 211, ENG 212, ENG 213, ENG 231, ENG 232, ENG 282, ENG 306, ENG 309, ENG 310, ENG 313, ENG 316, ENG 317, ENG 324, ENG 450, ENG 451, ENG 452, ENG 453, ENG 454, ENG 455, ENG 456, ENG 457, ENG 458 and ENG 449 were approved.
16. The committee approved proposals from the Dept. of English to withdraw courses ENW 204, ENW 207, ENW 309, ENW 317, ENW 357, and ENW 408.
17. Barbara Jacobson summarized her review of The New Community College of CUNY (NCC). Her report, read into the minutes on the next page, assessed how many of its credits would be transferable to Lehman College's Gen Ed program.
