



Doctor of Nursing Practice (BS TO DNP PROGRAM)

The Lehman College Department of Nursing Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program is a practice-focused doctoral degree program designed to prepare experts specialized advanced nursing practice. It builds upon the generalist foundation acquired through the baccalaureate or advanced generalist master's in nursing. Students can choose a Family Nurse Practitioner or Pediatric Nurse Practitioner track.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions
 - Have attained a baccalaureate degree in nursing from a nationally CCNE/ACEN/CNEA accredited college or university
 - Have attained minimum graduate GPA of B (3.2) or better in Nursing and overall BS study
- An unencumbered nursing license as a registered professional nurse currently registered in New York State
- At least one year working experience as an RN
- Three letters of reference pertaining of academic ability, professional competency and personal character
- Current resume or Curriculum Vitae indicating employment experience in advanced nursing practice for at least one year
- Personal statement specifying career goals and clear statement of how the DNP will advance the applicant's clinical practice
- Nursing Essay: A two-to -four (2-4) page description of an example of a common occurrence in clinical practice that the applicant would like to see changed
- Completion of the Biostatistics in Healthcare (NUR600) course within 5 years of the application date
- Participation in a face-to-face interview with the graduate admission committee
