Master of Science in Education

The 36-42 credit program leads to an M.S.Ed. degree in Early Childhood Education (Birth-Grade 2), general education. The program leads to initial and professional certification in New York State and are designed for candidates who have received no previous certification in early childhood but may have certification in a related area, in keeping with the State's emphasis on dual certification. The program is designed to prepare reflective practitioners in urban early childhood settings. Our Early Childhood Graduate Program is approved and accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children and NCATE. We are committed to preparing competent, qualified, ethical, and reflective practitioners for service in diverse communities who believe in promoting care, justice, and equity in urban settings. Our students work in infant and child care settings, Head Start programs and in our public and private school systems, in Pre-kindergarten, Kindergarten, First and Second grades.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Official transcripts from **all** post-secondary institutions attended
 - Have attained a bachelor's degree or its foreign equivalent from an accredited college or university
 - Have attained a minimum undergraduate grade point average of 3.0
- Two letters of recommendation
- A 500-word essay in English outlining your journey to a master's degree, your intellectual and academic experiences and interests, accomplishments, and career objectives
- Interview with faculty member

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

To qualify for the M.S.Ed. in Early Childhood Education (Birth – Grade 2), students must fulfill the following requirements:

- Submit edTPA, EAS and CST – Early Childhood Scores
- Complete 36-42 credits of prescribed course work
- Submit professional portfolio
- Submit application for Initial or Professional Certification
- Students must complete courses in three competency areas, including a supervised teaching experience
