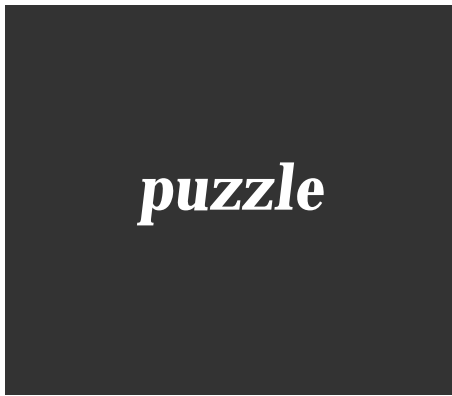

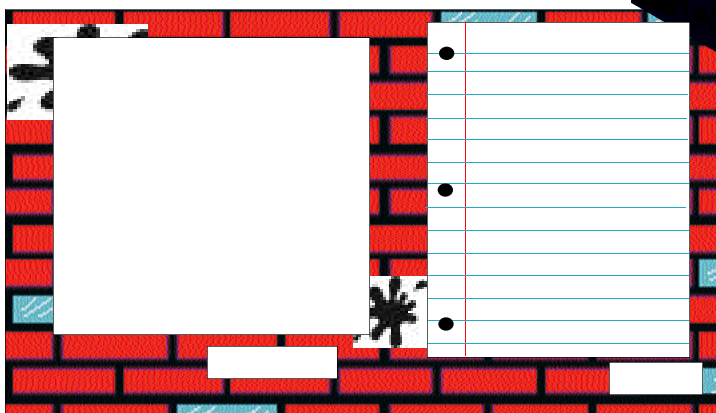

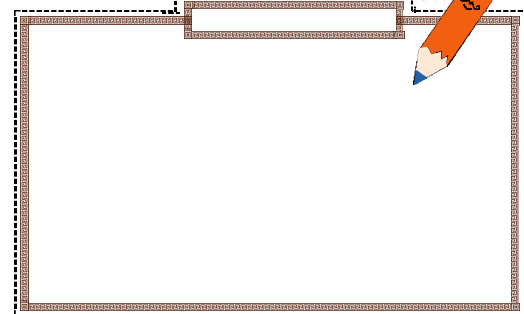
THE LITTLE ENGINE THAT COULD HOLIDAY PUPPET THEATER

A HOLIDAY GARDEN AND TRAIN SHOW
November 24 – January 7
At the magnificent Enid A. Haupt Conservatory it's the Holiday Garden and Train Show, one of New York's most popular holiday traditions! This miniature world of trains and historic buildings of Old Town New York features a breathtaking eight-foot model of the Garden's glorious Victorian Conservatory. Shining like spun sugar, it is nestled in the landscape where railway trains and trolleys wend their way across rustic bridges, disappearing into forest tunnels to reappear with a surprising flourish

across the terrain. Beautiful scale-model historic buildings from New York City's five boroughs and fanciful townhouses pop up along the way, and a towering castle and waterfall complete the magic. Paul Busse of Applied Imagination creates this display with natural materials throughout. Water, bark, leaves, twigs, hollow logs, mosses, acorns, flowers, seeds, and stones form a perfectly proportioned landscape inside the glasshouse.
