Getting Ready to Engage Transitions in Fall 2021

Online Instructional Mode

Fall 2021 MHSE Courses will be delivered in In-Person, **Hybrid** and Online

Early contact with your instructor. Write to your instructor prior to the beginning of your course. Inquire about the online platform and instructional format that you will be used.

Help Creating Community in Your Course and Get Expectation for Participation

*Our class will meet through the Zoom online conference system. Our success as an online class will depend on the same commitment we all bring to the physical classroom. **We will adopt the same rules and norms (take notes; participate by asking and answering questions; wear classroom-ready clothing).** For everyone's benefit, join the course in a quiet place whenever possible. Turn on your video whenever possible. Mute your microphone unless you are speaking. Close browser tabs not required for participating in class.*

Instructional Format for Fall 2021

Instructional Modes

In-Person (P) - All required class meetings occur on campus, during scheduled class meeting times. Contact includes instruction, learning activities, and interactions.

Hybrid(H)- Online contact hours (synchronous* or asynchronous**) displaces some portion of the required contact hours that would normally take place in a scheduled In-Person (face-to-face) class.

Online (O) - In an Online class (synchronous* or asynchronous**), all required contact hours are online. Contact includes instruction, learning activities, and interactions (both student-student and/or student-instructor). All the class work, examinations, quizzes, writing assignments, lab work, etc. are fully online. **All synchronous class meeting days/times must be listed in the schedule of classes for students.**

Covid -19 Vaccination & Campus Access

Other important reminders: (Updated August 16, 2021)

- **Vaccinate or Test** - As of today, anyone entering a CUNY facility for any reason will need to be fully vaccinated (defined as 14 days beyond the last vaccination shot) or show proof of a negative COVID-19 test taken at a CUNY testing site within the past seven days.
- **Proof of Vaccination** - Vaccinated employees can upload their vaccination verification documents to [CUNYfirst](#). These voluntary submissions will facilitate your access to a campus or office throughout the Fall, and will also exempt you from the need to participate in CUNY's weekly testing program. - **Everbridge VaxPass** - The symptom tracker feature of the Everbridge app is no longer in use; instead, the app now displays a CUNY VaxPass for those whose vaccine information has been submitted and verified in CUNYfirst. The VaxPass was designed as an additional tool to speed entry into CUNY campuses and offices. For simple, one-time setup instructions, please check the [VaxPass User Setup Guide](#).
- **Testing Program** - All faculty and staff members who have not provided proof of vaccination in CUNYfirst or who chose not to disclose their vaccination status need to enroll in CUNY's testing program and should have received an email with a link to enroll. Fieldwork in Fall 2021

Fieldwork maybe required for some courses whether in the catalogue description of not

Three levels of fieldwork

Level I- Classroom Observation

Level II- Classroom Observation and Working with Small Groups of Students

Level III-Student Teaching (Level I, Level II and Whole-class Instruction (Learning Segment)

Level I Required in the following courses ESC 501(20 hrs), ESC 502 (20 hrs) and ESC 506 (15 hrs)

Level II Required in the following course Methods Courses (25 hrs)

Level III-Student Teaching one semester (14 weeks: generally 8:30 a.m. -3:30 p.m.)

Level III- Student Internship (for Students who are Teachers of Records)

Fieldwork in Fall 2021

- Discuss with your academic advisor/program coordinator when to expect to take courses that require fieldwork and student teaching/internship
- You will have to pass a background check (including fingerprinting) in order to conduct student teaching
- Keep a log of all Level I and II fieldwork hours
- Discuss fieldwork requirements and configuration with your instructors
- In Fall 2020, it is anticipated that Level I and Level II fieldwork requirements will be conducted in an alternative mode using video observations.
- There might be special program requirements in order to get permission to conduct Level III (student teaching and internship)

Fieldwork in Fall 2021: Application Deadlines

- Student must apply the previous semester to conduct student teaching/internship
- Online application
- Consult Your Academic Advisor Before Applying
- Application for Fall Semester Student Teaching/Internship Due April 15
- Application for Spring Semester Student Teaching?Internship Due Nov 1
