
GRE Graduate Record Examination

Worried about the GRE?

Why Take It	The test is required for admission to most graduate schools and growing number of business schools.	
Test Structure	The GRE consists of a 75-minute Analytical Writing section, a 30-minute Verbal Reasoning section, and a 45-minute Quantitative Reasoning section.	
Test Format	Offered in paper-based and computer-adaptive formats.	
How It's Scored	Total Composite Score 120 - 180.	
Cost	\$150	
Testing Time	3+ hours depending on the format	
How Long Are Scores Valid For?	5 years	

- Most commonly required admissions test for graduate school
- Most applicants take a computer based test, which adapts the difficulty level of its questions each time you submit an answer
- Know the program codes for the 4 schools you wish to apply to before the test.
- Valid for 5 years
- Fee: \$205 (not \$150)

- Of the 4 sections, 2 are adaptive and will adjust the questions' difficulty level each time you answer.
- Valid for 5 years



- Most common admission test for law school
- For admission the following year, you should take the LSAT by December
- While there are 4 sections, the Logical Reasoning section is repeated, for a total of 5 sections
- Every section but the Writing Sample is multiple choice
- There is a fee waiver program.
- Valid for 5 years

Chemical & Physical Foundations of Biological Systems

- 95 Minutes
- 59 Questions 10 passage based sections; 15 individual questions
- Biology (5%), Biochemistry (25%), Organic Chemistry (15%), General Chemistry (30%), and Physics (25%)



Critical Analysis & Reasoning Skills (CARS)

- 90 Minutes
- 53 Questions 9 passage based sections
- 50% Humanities, 50% Social Sciences



Biological & Biochemical Foundations of Living Systems


- 95 Minutes
- 59 Questions 10 passage based sections; 15 individual questions
- Biochemistry (25%), Biology (65%), General chemistry (5%), and Organic Chemistry (5%)



Psychological, Social, & Biological Foundations of Behavior

- 95 Minutes
- 59 Questions 10 passage based sections; 15 individual questions
- 65% Psychology, 30% Sociology and 5% Biology
