When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by representatives from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program directors.

**2. *Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:***

Each semester, Lehman College, will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

**3. *Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:***

This articulation agreement will be publicizing on the BMCC website and on the Lehman website. Transfer advisers at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.


