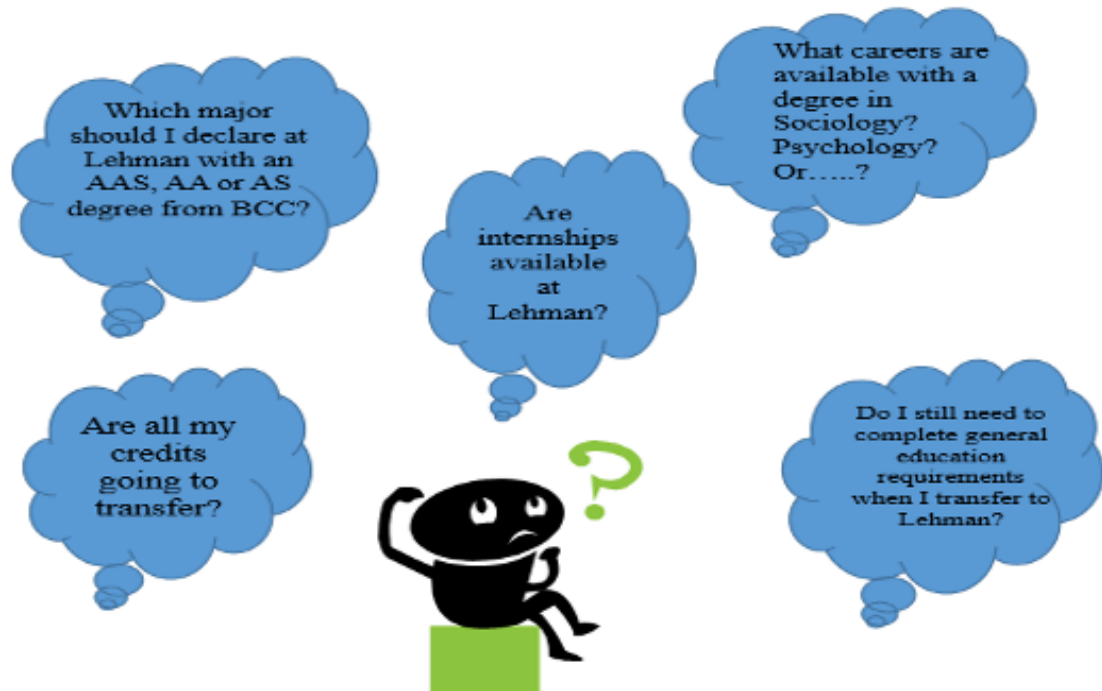

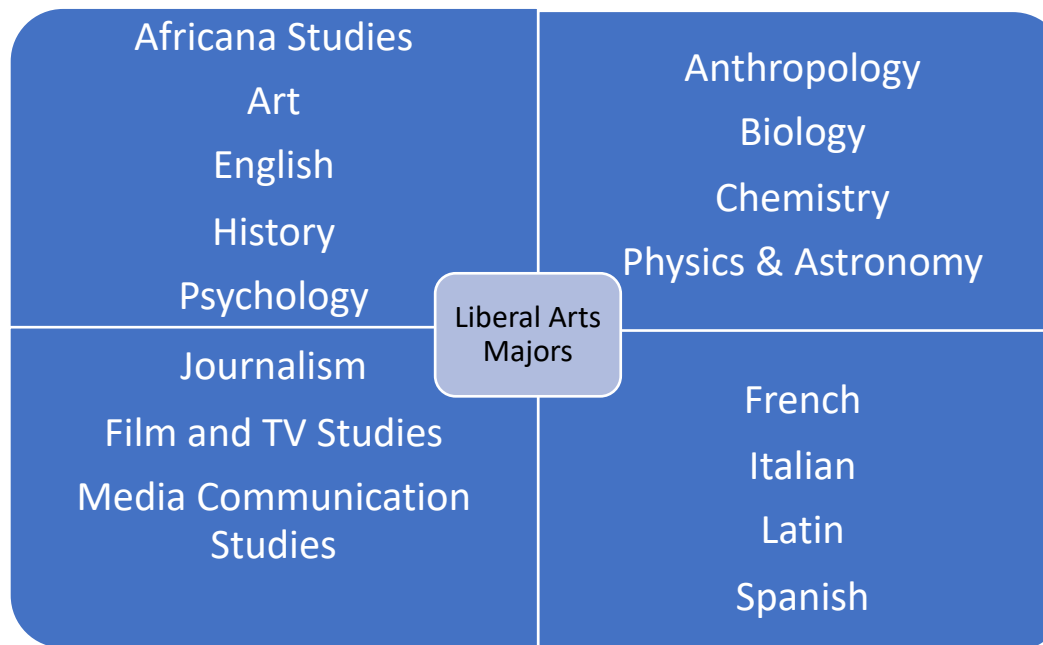

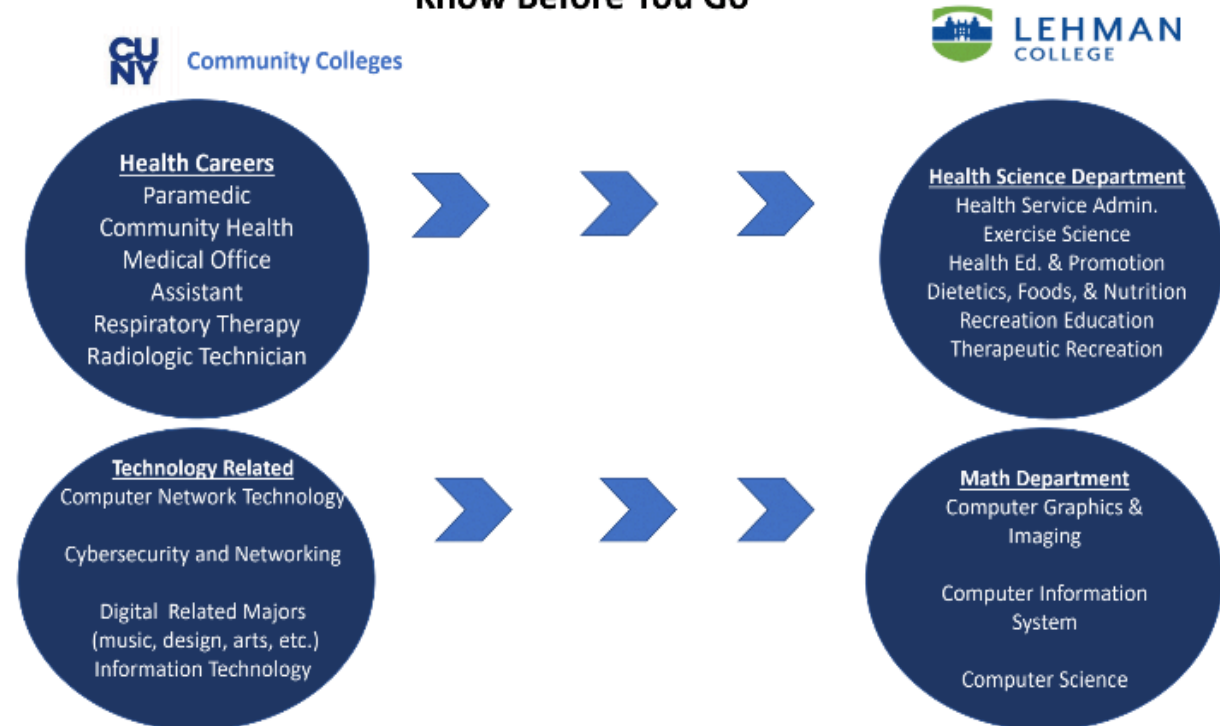

Student: “I would like to major in liberal arts.”

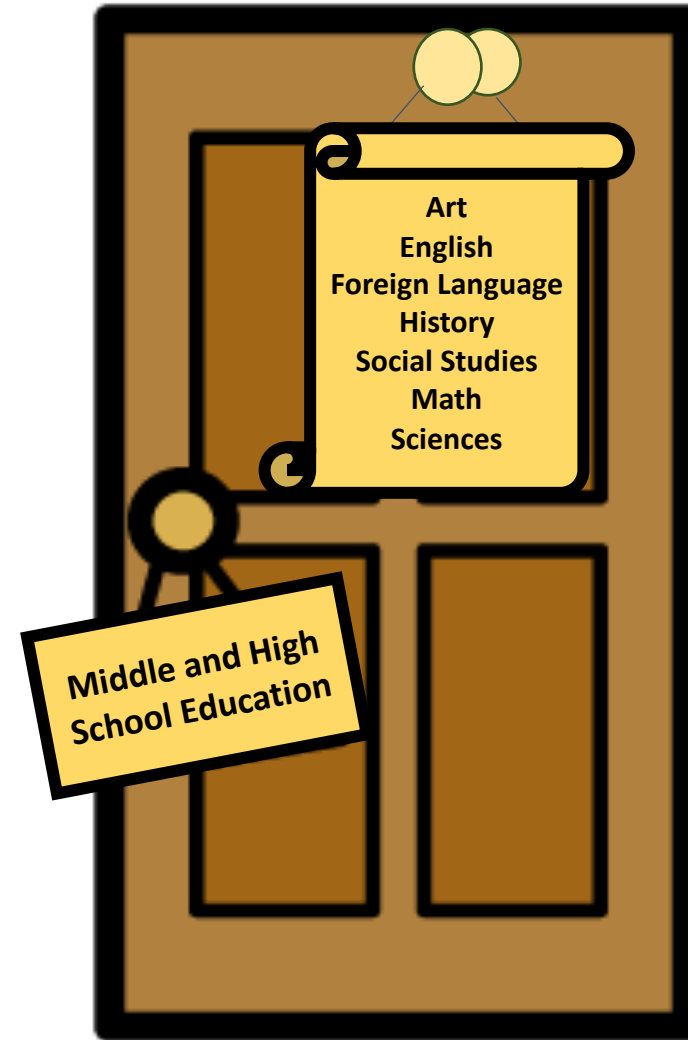
Advisor: “Sorry, Lehman does not offer a major in liberal arts but you can select a major that is considered liberal arts.”

Nursing:

Completion of the following science prerequisites with a C or higher grade: (BIO 181, 182, 230; CHE 114/115, 120/121)

Social Work:

Minimum 2.9 GPA & completion of SWK 237 and SOC 166 to apply

Health Science:

Dietetics, Foods and Nutrition: must declare Option II prior to Option I
Health Service Administration: minimum 2.5 GPA required

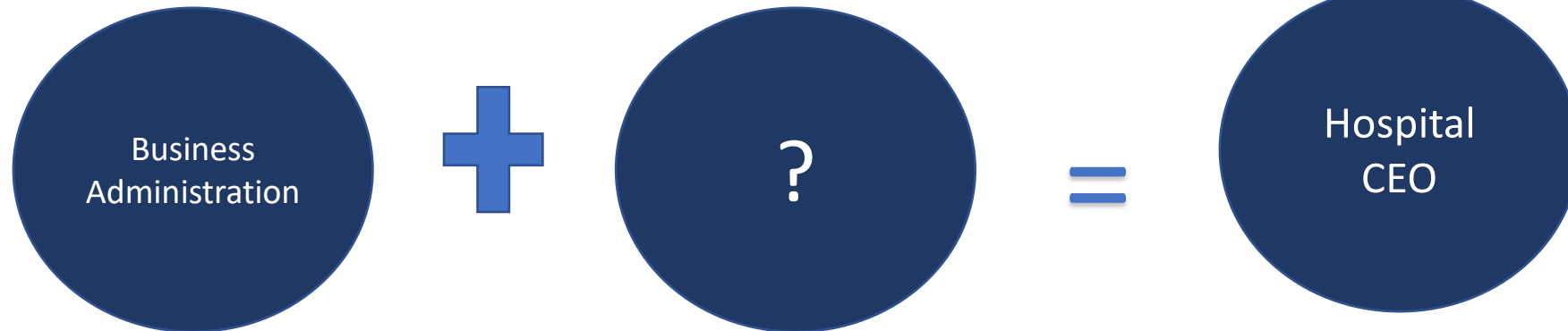
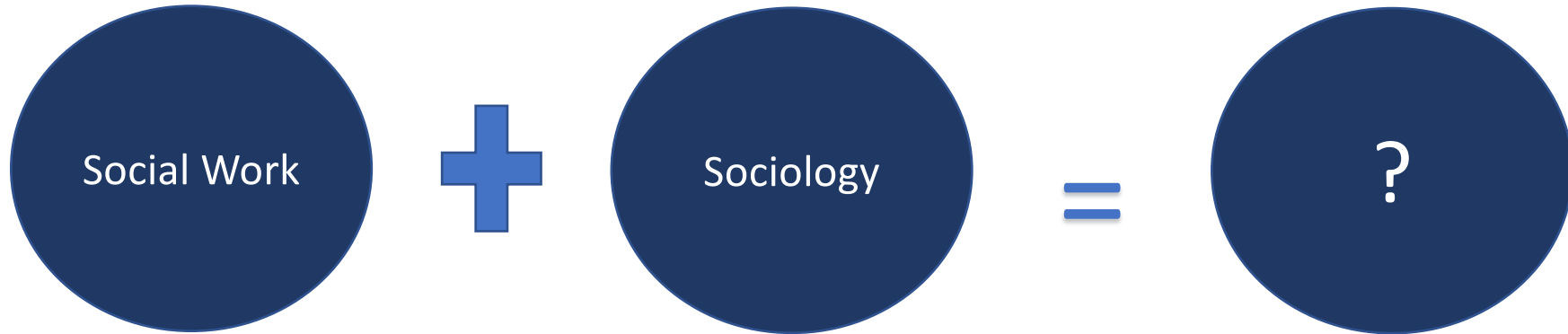

Develop a solid background in business including finance, marketing, and accounting.
Gain experience through part-time, summer, or internship positions in financial service firms.
